

**Requirements**

- 163 credits for degree with two majors
- Maximum credit load of 18 per semester

**Notes**

- Shaded courses must be taken concurrently as a block of classes.
- When two courses are on the same line, take the course offered that year.
- Courses in **red** are offered both semesters and may be switched.
- The # before the course number marks the prerequisite courses for either elementary or early childhood student teaching or both.
- Elementary student teaching must be in the senior year and early childhood student teaching in the fifth year.

Successful completion of this major and licensure requirements provides students eligibility for:

- Minnesota Licensure: Birth-Grade 6
