I think we might all admit to scratching our heads when we listen to some of the ideas we hear. I shake my head when I hear ideas about God and spiritual issues from people who either have an overactive imagination or no basis for their ideas except their opinions or the opinions of others. The abyss of natural human ignorance is clearly evident in the area of spiritual matters. God can't be measured. He exists outside the physical world and cannot be observed like atoms, electrons, or the stars.
