

# MN Licensure Exams & Registration for Classes

- Skills exam requirement statutory
- ▶ Temporary vs. five-year license

## **Current Testing Options**

- Basic Skills Testing
  - MTLEs in Reading, Writing and Math
    - Passing score of 240 or better
  - ACT Plus Writing
    - Composite Score ≥ 22 AND Combined English/Writing ≥ 21
  - SAT
    - Reading  $\geq 510$  Writing  $\geq 510$  Math  $\geq 520$

- PRAXIS I tests taken before 9/1/2010 are still accepted.
  - Reading  $\geq 173$  Writing  $\geq 172$  Math  $\geq 171$

- Immersion Exemption for Non-Native English Speakers

## **Current Testing Options**

### MTLE Pedagogy Tests

- Consists of 2 subtests
- Offered at Early Childhood, Elementary, or Secondary levels (scope of license determines which level to take)
- If a teacher candidate is applying for a K-12 license, they need to take either the Elementary OR Secondary Pedagogy testing. Early Childhood Education teacher candidates need to take either Early Childhood OR Elementary Pedagogy testing.

## MTLE Content Testing

- Consists of 2 subtests, EXCEPT Elem Ed has 3
- Most licensure areas have content testing
- PRAXIS II Tests are no longer accepted.

## **Future Testing Options**

- Basic Skills Testing Will be Changing
  - Moving from MTLEs to NES (National Evaluation Series)
    - Expected to move to NES exams summer 2016
- Additional Basic Skills Exams Will Be Accepted
  - ACT Plus Writing
  - SAT
  - GRE
  - NES
  - PRAXIS I
  - BOT has until July 2016 to adopt minimum passing scores for each test



## edTPA Remediation Policy

- Remediation is currently at the discretion of each institution/college or university.
- Recommendation Remediation process is not needed for this year, rather we will watch to see how the extra training sessions affect scores.
- No remediation policy in effect for the 2015−16 school year.

# Education Division Remediation Policy Recommendation & Motion

- Teacher candidate meets with Dr. Whaley to determine what is required to reach a passing score.
- Next, the candidate would present the revised edTPA to Dr. Whaley and a college supervisor who would assess and decide if the work passes or needs further revision.
- Candidates continue through the remediation process until they pass (MLC grad requirement).

Motion was tabled, pending further study.

"The Education Division discussed briefly the edTPA remediation policy for Martin Luther College (MLC). MN BOT written guide lines are not available for example for institutions. Verbal direction indicates institutions of higher education training teacher candidates in MN are to have a formal policy for remediation. The procedural examples of MLC policy implementation may be considered in the future. Those procedures will be revisited in the future."

"M/S/P – For students who do not pass edTPA, remediation is required."
