Enrollment Remains Steady for 2015-16

We are impressed each year with the talent and experience our incoming students bring to our campus, and we are grateful for continued recruitment efforts from all parents and pastors as well as our area Lutheran high schools and prep schools. Our official opening enrollment for 2015 - 2016 is 723 students on campus. Of that total enrollment, our areas of study break down in this way: Education: 541, Preseminary: 169, Staff Ministry: 5, Other classifications: 8. Our current enrollment of preseminary students continues to be lower than needed, so we ask everyone to pray for pastors and to urge gifted young men to consider the pastoral ministry.

"No one who is enrolled into this summer Bible camp is a member of the church, and they all have different backgrounds. It is awesome to be a witness of our faith to these children. Many of them know the Bible stories already, but we tell them straight from God's Word, so many times they all learn a little more information from each story that they didn't know before. It is the coolest thing to see a child's face light up when they know the answer.

"Some days are challenging, trying to keep up with about 20 kids, but at the end of the day it is always rewarding to have been able to teach the kids and see how much they grow daily. The Holy Spirit is definitely at work here."

This past spring and summer, 135 MLC students participated in our Daylight USA program serving over 60 congregations!



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New Teacher Induction Program Expands

New Teacher Induction (NTI)—which includes mentoring for two years, training seminars for beginning teachers, and mentor observations continues to grow. NTI is expanding from 68 mentors in 2014-15 to 106 mentors in 2015-16. In 2014, 77 teachers were mentored, and today well over 130 teachers are being mentored through the program.

NTI's purpose is to improve student academic achievement by supporting the development of new teachers. Research suggests that highquality induction programs enhance teacher



retention, strengthen student achievement, and develop teacher leadership. Many schools have recognized the value of this program for their new teachers, resulting in NTI now working in all 12 districts of our synod.

Surveys Provide Input for New Site Plan

Part of MLC's strategic planning directs the college to "develop a plan for on-going maintenance, renovation, and expansion of facilities." Input on facilities was solicited from faculty, staff, and students through surveys last spring. The updated site plan projects campus facility needs over the next 8-10 years and will be presented to the governing board for approval. Once the board approves the updated site plan, they will consider the development of a capital campaign to fund new construction included in the master site plan on a prioritized basis. At this time the updated site plan includes the addition of a field house and additional dormitory space on the main campus, along with locker rooms, indoor practice space for spring sports, and an outdoor track and field at the athletic field complex.

Ladies' Auxiliary Active on the MLC Campus

MLC Ladies' Auxiliary funded an extensive number of requests from many MLC departments last year totaling over \$26,000. These projects funded non-budgeted needs, including outreach opportunities, international programs, classroom materials, technology needs, and audiovisual improvements. Another Auxiliary program is called "Befriend an MLC Student."
