MLC Earns High Rankings

Though tuition, room and board at Martin Luther College is rising every year—as it is rising at all colleges across the country—the net price our MLC students pay has risen very little. This is due to your generosity! Your gifts allow us to award need-based and meritbased grants and scholarships to our students – in addition to the financial



aid they receive from the government and other sources. Because of your generosity, MLC has received national recognition again this year by several different organizations. Our Master of Science in Education earned Affordable College's #1 in America Best Value, and #3 in America for Most Affordable Online Master's Degree. Our undergraduate degree program was ranked in the top 1% – #3 in America – for 2018 Best Value by *College Factual*. And *MONEY* magazine ranked our undergrad program #1 in Minnesota as a Best College for Your Money. Thank you for helping MLC provide a high-quality education at an affordable price. Thank you for partnering with us as we prepare these young men and women to share the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Daylight Provides Ministry Experiences

At MLC, experiential learning allows our students to take what they have learned in the college classroom and apply it in real-life settings. Some of that experiential learning occurs in the MLC Daylight program. The Daylight program matches future pastors, teachers, and staff ministers with WELS/ELS congregations who request help in reaching out to their communities. In groups of various sizes, MLC students assist with sports camps, vacation Bible school, neighborhood canvassing, and other outreach and worship activities. Starting this school year, MLC's goal is that every graduate will participate in a Daylight short-term mission during their time at MLC. "This experience gave me a taste of what the called servant's life is all about," said one MLC student. "I learned so much about the impact a teacher has on a child. Master Plan Study

MLC will celebrate its 25th anniversary in 2020. In preparation for that celebration, the MLC Strategic Plan directs our administration to update the Campus Master Plan.

That Master Plan will also be an element of the 25th Anniversary Capital Campaign set to be introduced in the summer of 2019. To establish a comprehensive analysis of our campus use, needs, and potential, representatives from Credo Higher Education Consultants have been conducting factfinding workshops with MLC faculty, staff, and students.

That process will continue this semester with the investigating of space and place requirements, introducing scenarios to the campus family for feedback, and developing an action plan for implementation.

MLC Promotes Financial Literacy

In order to provide important financial information to students on campus, MLC has partnered with CashCourse – a non-profit organization that provides financial education courses. Students have different topics to complete online each year, and the application of these resources helps them to make better financial decisions. Last year over 300 students – in small groups or individual consultation – were served with important financial information through the work of MLC's Financial Literacy Coordinator, JoElyn Krohn.



Each year CashCourse tracks the schools that utilize these resources. Once again MLC has made the national top 10 list for web engagement and has also been granted the 2018 Reimbursement Program to help promote the CashCourse resources. This spring the financial literacy program will offer monthly drawings to encourage students to increase their financial literacy.

Ladies' Auxiliary Funds Many Departments

MLC Ladies' Auxiliary funded an extensive number of requests from many MLC departments last year totaling over \$24,000. These projects funded non-budgeted needs, including outreach opportunities, international programs, classroom materials, technology needs, and audiovisual improvements. This year's projects include travel assistance for student teachers, a 3-D printer, a baseball pitching screen, instrument microphones, dinnerware for events, and many more - totaling about \$26,000 for all the projects. The Auxiliary is especially grateful for the generosity of our supporters as we start this project season. Already funded are nine projects with a value of almost \$14,000! Thank you!
