In careful stewardship of his gifts of health and strength, we will work to keep our campus family safe, from dormitory to classroom to athletic venue. We will show love to our neighbors in the New Ulm community by hosting only essential, safe, on-campus events, and providing virtual events whenever possible. Our promotion of the EQUIPPING CHRISTIAN WITNESSES (ECW) campaign has been hindered by COVID-19 restrictions. However, the needs for ministry recruitment, increased student financial assistance, and campus facility enhancements are still very real. We are thankful for so many who have kept ECW in their prayers and their donations. An extension of the campaign until June 30, 2022, has been approved by the Conference of Presidents, and requests for presentations and materials have already increased through the fall months. Dear Brothers and Sisters,
