The women's soccer team moved into third place in the UMAC standings with two weeks to go following wins over Northwestern and North Central last weekend.

Jenna Maurer (*LPS*), Lauren Maertz (*GPLHS*), and Hailey Johnson (*FVL*) each scored a goal in the Knights' 3-2 win over Northwestern on Friday. Maurer and Danielle Hall (*WLA*) each scored twice, while Alyssa Maertz (*GPLHS*) and Lauren Maertz scored one goal apiece in a 6-0 shutout win at North Central on Saturday.

Maurer was named UMAC Offensive Player of the Week for her performance during the week. She leads the team with nine goals this season, and now has 25 for her career.

Aaron Markgraf (*WLA*) of the men's soccer team was named UMAC Offensive Player of the Week following a strong performance in a pair of games last weekend.

The sophomore midfielder scored the lone goal in the Knights' 3-1 loss at Northwestern on Friday, and then tied a career high with three goals to help MLC defeat North Central 4-0 on Saturday. **Jacob Shepherd** (*LPS*) scored the other goal against the Rams in that win, while keeper **Caleb King** (*WLA*) earned the shutout.

Markgraf currently holds the team lead with eight goals, 17 points, and 18 shots on goal this season. He has also been a strong two-way player for the Knights, who are now 4-6 in conference play and have a chance to play their way into the top half of the league standings and the UMAC Postseason Tournament in the final two weeks.
