## Women's Basketball Splits Weekend

The women's basketball team split a pair of games last weekend, losing 63-52 at Northwestern on Friday, and defeating North Central 53-51 on Saturday.

The Knights hung tough against Northwestern in spite of a tough shooting night. First-year guard **Grace Schultz** (*FVL*) led MLC with 20 points, while junior **Erin Schmeling** (*SCLHS*) joined her in double figures with ten points.

MLC won Saturday's game at North Central thanks to a **Faith Schroeder** (*MLS*) putback in the final minute that gave the Knights the lead. Schultz and Schmeling led the Knights in scoring again with 15 and 13 points, respectively.

## Fall Student-Athletes Shine with Academic Honors



76 MLC student-athletes earned academic honors

The UMAC announced its academic award winners for the fall sports season on Tuesday, January 27, and MLC finished with a conference-best 76 Academic All-UMAC honorees.

Student-athletes earn academic all conference honors if they finish with a GPA of 3.5 or higher in their semester of competition.

With 76 honorees, the Knights tallied 12 more than any other conference school.

MLC also finished with the highest team GPA in four of the seven UMAC-sponsored fall sports. The football (2.976), men's soccer (3.381), volleyball (3.662), and women's soccer (3.678) teams each finished atop the conference.
