



## Schultz, Nass Earn UMAC Honors

The women's basketball team saw two of its players earn all-conference honors from the UMAC following a fourth-place finish in the final league standings.

Junior forward **Leah Nass** (*Manitowoc LHS*) was named Second Team All-UMAC after leading the Knights with 7.3 rebounds per game. She also finished second on the team with 23 blocks, and fourth with 8.4 points per game.

**Grace Schultz** (*FVL*) was named UMAC Freshman of the Year after finishing the season as the Knights' leading scorer at 11.4 points per game. She also led MLC with 58 steals and averaged 5.9 rebounds per game.

## Baseball Opens Season with Trip to Florida

The baseball team opened its season with a ten-game trip to Florida during spring break. The Knights went 1-9 against stiff competition, but should benefit from the experience during conference play, which begins on March 27 against Crown.

**Jason Lindemann** (*LPS*) was the Knights' leading hitter, batting .455 in eight games. He also led MLC with six runs scored, and tied for the team lead with ten hits and two doubles. **Jonathan Kock** (*LPS*) finished with a .400 batting average, while **Travis Kretsch** (*MVL*) smashed his first career home run and led MLC with five RBI.

Kock was also the Knights' top pitcher, earning the team's lone win and finishing with an ERA of 5.25 in three appearances.

## Brassow Named First Team All-UMAC

Junior **Todd Brassow** (*MLS*) was named First Team All-UMAC in men's basketball, while teammate **Luke Rothe** (*LPS*) earned honorable mention all conference recognition.

Brassow averaged 17.2 points per game during the season to lead MLC, and his 17.1 points per game during UMAC play ranked third in the conference. He also led MLC with 24 steals and finished second on the team with 4.2 rebounds per game.

Rothe averaged 14.2 points per game and also led the UMAC in assists (95) for the second consecutive season.
