

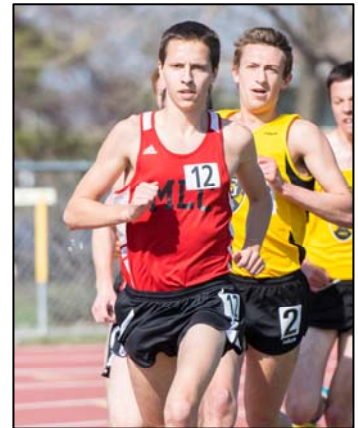


Track Takes Fifth at UMAC Outdoor Championships

The men's and women's track teams both finished fifth at the UMAC Outdoor Track & Field Championships held at Minnesota Morris last weekend.

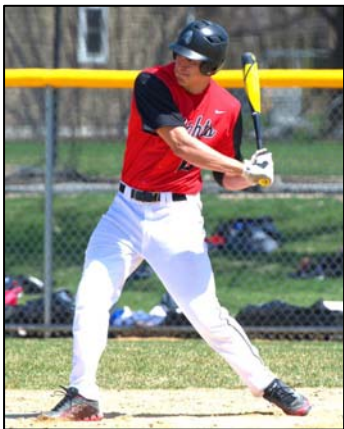
Katie Zietlow (*LPS*) was the top performer for the women with three separate top three finishes. She won the Javelin Throw with a throw of 34.9 meters, and then took third place in the 400 Meter Hurdles and the High Jump.

Todd Brassow (*MLS*) won the High Jump event for the third consecutive year at the conference meet, while **Martin Loescher** (*KMLHS*) and **Justin Wilkens** (*Haymarket VA*) each finished second in at least one event, and in the top seven in another.

Baseball Team Sets Records in Final Series



Nemmers at the plate

The baseball team saw its season come to a close last weekend at Northland, but several players set new single-season program records.

Senior first baseman **Andrew Nemmers** (*LPS*) broke the previous record of 45 hits in a single season with 50 hits in 2015. Nemmers finished the year with a team-best .373 batting average, and also led the team in runs batted in (28) and slugging percentage (.500) with two home runs and 11 doubles.

Junior pitcher **Matt Olson** (*SCLHS*) set a new mark for innings pitched in a single season with 67.0, and also finished with the second-most strikeouts in a season with 60. At the plate, Olson set a new school record with 30 runs scored in 2015, and finished one shy of the school mark with 14 stolen bases.

Friebe Named First Team All-UMAC

First-year catcher **Jessica Friebe** (*MLS*) was named First Team All-UMAC in softball following a strong season at the plate and behind it for the Knights.

Friebe finished the season with a .339 batting average to go with a team-high 15 stolen bases and .442 slugging percentage. During conference play, she was among the top hitters on the Knights with a .369 batting average.

Emily Waldek (*Trumbull CN*) received Honorable Mention All-UMAC recognition, and was named to the All-Defensive Team as an outfielder. Waldek led MLC with 13 doubles and 33 hits this season, and finished her four-year career with the second-most hits (164) in program history.
