Senior **Todd Brassow** (*MLS*) was the top finisher for the men, taking first place in the High Jump with a jump of 2.01 meters. That height moved him into 11th place in all of NCAA Division III in that event this season.

The women were led by several athletes in the field events. **Stephanie Rockhoff** (*Shoreland*) and **Emily Muir** (*LPS*) each finished in the top five in the Triple Jump, while **Jade St. Germaine** (*LPS*) made the finals in the Long Jump and took home ninth place in that event.

Greg Holzhueter Named New Men's Basketball Coach



Former three-sport MLC athlete Greg Holzhueter accepted a call to become the next head men's basketball coach at MLC.

He will replace Jim Unke, who served as the head coach of the program for the last 19 seasons, during which he won 164 games. Unke will continue to serve as the Athletic Director at MLC.

Holzhueter, who earned All-UMAC honors in football, basketball, and baseball during his MLC career, spent the last three seasons as the head basketball coach at Bethany Lutheran College (BLC), where he finished with a record of 23-54 overall, including a 20-24 record in UMAC play. Prior to that, he was the lead assistant coach for two seasons with the BLC Vikings.
