Senior **Mariah Schoof** (*MVL*) became the third MLC women's basketball player to record 100 career blocks in Monday's game at Augsburg.

Schoof now has 102 blocks for her career, and also became the first MLC player to record at least 100 blocks and 100 three-point field goals in a career. She also moved into third place in program history with 126 career three-point field goals.

This season, Schoof leads MLC in points per game (13.7) and blocks (11), and also ranks among the top three MLC players in assists (nine), rebounds per game (4.8), and steals (eight).

Both teams struggled to stop the other in the fast-paced contest, but the Vikings were able to hold off the Knights down the stretch to earn the win.

MLC started three first-year players in the game, and each performed well to keep the Knights within striking distance. Point guard **Jeffrey Parker** (*Evergreen*) set new career highs with 24 points and six assists. Forward **Ian Paulsen** (*LPS*) scored 17 of his 19 points in the second half to help lead a comeback, while forward **Richard Eckmann** (*Trimont MN*) set a new career high with 17 points and made six of his nine attempts from the field, including three of four attempts from beyond the three-point arc.
