



Schoof, Schultz Move Up Career Scoring List

Mariah Schoof (*MVL*) and **Grace Schultz** (*FVL*) both moved into the top five of the MLC women's basketball career scoring list this season.

Schoof ranks third in program history with 866 career points after scoring 18 points in a 70-59 win over St. Scholastica on February 4. The senior forward also ranks third in program history in career blocks (117) and three-point field goals (150).

Schultz moved into fifth place over the weekend with 838 career points. The junior wing scored 14 points in Saturday's win over CSS, and ranks fourth in program history with 314 career field goals.

The men's basketball team led for the majority of Friday's game at UW-Superior, but was unable to hold off the Yellowjackets down the stretch in an 89-72 loss.

The Knights led 42-38 at the half, and still led 60-57 with just under 12 minutes to play in the game, but the Yellowjackets raced into the lead with a 16-3 run, and then held off the Knights the rest of the way.

Ian Paulsen (*LPS*) led MLC with 16 points and 12 rebounds. This season he leads the team in points per game (12.7), rebounds per game (7.7), blocks (37), and steals (33).

Nate Lindloff (*MLS*) added 15 points and made five of eight attempts from beyond the three-point arc. He is shooting a team-best 49.2 percent from downtown this season.

Junior **Rachel Riediger** (*Luther*) registered the only point for the men's and women's tennis teams in a loss to Macalester on February 4.
