Men Tie for Fifth at UMAC Outdoor Championships

MLC tied Bethany Lutheran for fifth place at the UMAC Outdoor Men's Track & Field Championships last weekend at Minnesota Morris.

Senior **Todd Brassow** (*MLS*) led the way for the Knights, winning the High Jump for the fourth consecutive year at the event, and breaking his own meet record with a jump of 2.0 meters. He was named All-UMAC for the fourth straight season.

Martin Loescher (*KMLHS*) finished third in the Javelin Throw, while **Josh Arndt** (*SCLHS*) took home top ten finishes in the 100 Meters (seventh), Long Jump (eighth), and 200 Meters (ninth).

Zietlow Leads Women to Fifth at Conference Meet

MLC finished fifth at the UMAC Women's Outdoor Track & Field Championships last weekend with 50 total points.

Katie Zietlow (*LPS*) led MLC with a first place finish in the Javelin Throw with a winning throw of 33.68 meters Friday night. She backed that up with a second place finish in the High Jump on Saturday, and was named All-UMAC for her efforts.

Charlotte Huebner (*Lakeside*) also received All-UMAC honors after taking second in the Javelin Throw, and then finished ninth in the 100 Meter Hurdles.

Stephanie Rockhoff (*Shoreland*), **Rylee Weisensel** (*MVL*), and **Rachel Winter** (*Manitowoc LHS*) also scored points in multiple events for the Knights at the event.

Lemke Named First Team All-UMAC

Sophomore shortstop **Megan Lemke** (*Shoreland*) was named First Team All-UMAC on Monday after a strong season in which she led the Knights in many statistical categories.

Lemke finished the season as the MLC leader in batting average (.398), on-base percentage (.435), slugging percentage (.578), doubles (nine), home runs (two), runs batted in (23), and hits (33).

Teammate **Jessica Friebe** (*MLS*) received honorable mention recognition. She led MLC in runs scored (26) and stolen bases (12) while starting 23 of 29 games behind the plate. She also finished second on the Knights in batting average (.338), on-base percentage (.393), and hits (26).
