



Women's Soccer Shutout Streak Reaches Four Games

The women's soccer team recorded its fourth consecutive shutout in a 3-0 win over North Central on Tuesday, September 19.

The Knights entered the game with back-to-back-to-back shutouts against Finlandia, Crown, and Northland. During this four-game stretch, MLC has outscored its opponents 14-0.

The team is led by a veteran back line featuring seniors **Sarah Kell** (*WLA*), **Emily Muir** (*LPS*), and **Elise Rosenbaum** (*Michigan LHS*). That groups has allowed only nine shots on goal against goalkeeper **Erin Feddersen** (*Great Mills MD*) during the streak.

Kira Grev Records 1,000 Kills



Grev skies for the kill

Senior volleyball player **Kira Grev** (*SCLHS*) became the fifth player in program history to record 1,000 career kills on Saturday, September 16.

Grev and the Knights entered Saturday's UMAC triangular at St. Scholastica only 13 kills shy of the milestone. Grev led the team with 12 kills in the Knights' 3-0 win over St. Scholastica, and then reached the milestone with 12 more kills in a 3-0 sweep of Crown.

Grev now has 1,022 kills for her career. She also ranks among the program's all-time leaders in career attacks (3,318), kills per set (2.80), and digs (895). With 105 more digs this season, Grev would become the third player in program history to record 1,000 career kills and digs.

Zuberbier finished atop the men's leaderboard with a career-low round of 78 to help the Knights to a third-place finish in the team competition.

Lindemann shot a career-low round of 88 to finish second on the final women's leaderboard, just one shot off the first-place finish. The women took third place out of six teams in attendance with a season-best team score of 418 total strokes.
