The women's basketball team came back from a pair of tough conference losses over the weekend to defeat Viterbo University 60-48 on Tuesday in a non-conference game.

The Knights never trailed in the game. They led 21-11 after the first quarter, and the V-Hawks never cut their deficit below nine points the rest of the way.

Mariah Schoof (MVL) led MLC with 14 points, making six of her nine shots from the field. She also added a team-high five assists. Faith Schroeder (MLS) scored ten points and grabbed six rebounds off the bench, while Jade St. Germaine (LPS) controlled the paint with nine points, eight rebounds, and three blocks.
