At a marine laboratory in the small town of Discovery Bay, Jamaica, students snorkeled through coral reefs and collected creatures to study. Students interviewed locals in the nearby town for an assignment and came out of it with new Jamaican friends. "The local people reminded me of the importance of friendliness," Micah says. "I was constantly greeted with a smile by people that had no reason to greet me."
