

Women Look to Bounce Back

The women's basketball team is looking to get back into the win column this week following a 52-50 loss to St. Scholastica on January 3.

The Knights held a 23-20 halftime lead against the Saints in the first game of the new year, but CSS was able to come back thanks to 48 percent shooting in the second half. MLC trailed by six in the final minute before a late comeback fell just short in the final seconds.

Senior Jade St. Germaine (*LPS*) scored a season-high 23 points to go with 10 rebounds for MLC. Grace Schultz (*FVL*) added 15 points and a game-high 11 rebounds.

MBU came back in the second half and held a two-point lead in the final minute until sophomore guard **Austin DeNoyer** (*Lakeside*) knocked down a three-pointer with 37 seconds to play to give the Knights the lead for the final time.

DeNoyer led MLC with 17 points and 11 rebounds in the game. **Richard Eckmann** (*Trimont MN*) scored 12 points and grabbed nine rebounds for the Knights.
