Senior guard **Grace Schultz** (*FVL*) set a new MLC women's basketball single-season record with 85 steals this season.

Schultz broke the previous record of 84, set by Emma Babinec ('06) during the 2005-06 season, in the Knights' 74-59 defeat at Minnesota Morris on February 7. Schultz finished that game with 11 points, five rebounds, and three steals.

Schultz has two games remaining in her MLC career to finish her climb among the all-time leaders in several statistical categories. She currently ranks second in career steals (253), third in career points (1,264), and fourth in career rebounds (648).
