Men's Soccer Sweeps Player of the Week Awards

The men's soccer team won both its games last week to secure the number three seed in this week's UMAC Soccer Tournament, and also swept the conference Player of the Week awards for the second consecutive week.

Stephen Oelhafen (*LPS*) was named UMAC Offensive Player of the Week after scoring three goals and assisting on another in MLC's 6-1 win over Northland on October 27. Oelhafen's seven points were the most by any UMAC player this season.

Aaron Swanson (*SCLA*) won UMAC Defensive Player of the Week honors as a center back after holding Bethany Lutheran and Northland to only one goal on six shots on goal during the week. Swanson also added an assist in the Knights' win over BLC.

Senior wide receiver **Josh Arndt** (*SCLA*) and sophomore cornerback **Ben Arndt** (*SCLA*) each had big games in the football team's 41-28 win over Minnesota Morris.

Josh Arndt set a new MLC single-game record with 222 receiving yards on only four receptions and scored three touchdowns. He also tied the school record for the longest pass reception with an 87-yard touchdown catch. He was named UMAC Offensive Player of the Week for the second time this season, and was also named to the D3football.com Team of the Week for his efforts.

Ben Arndt picked off two passes in the win to give him a UMAC-best six interceptions this season. Both turnovers came deep in MLC territory, helping the defense hold off the Cougars to secure the win.

Men and Women Take Fourth at UMAC Championships
