Paulsen Moves Up Career Rankings



Junior forward **Ian Paulsen** (*LPS*) has moved up the MLC career records lists with a strong season for the men's basketball team.

On January 26, Paulsen moved into second place in program history in career blocks, passing Aaron Schultz's ('09) total of 113. Paulsen now has 117 career blocks, and trails the all-time MLC record of 148 set by Tom Engelbrecht ('04).

Paulsen also moved his name up the all-time rebounding list, and now ranks sixth in program history with 459 career rebounds.

Paulsen was named to the 2017-18 UMAC All-Defense team and is also the first player in program history to record at least 100 career blocks and steals.
