The men's soccer team was rewarded for its wins over Minnesota Morris (2-1) and Northwestern (2-0) last week with a pair of UMAC Player of the Week honors.

Joe Graumann (*Lakeside*) was named Offensive Player of the Week after scoring two goals in the win over UMM, and then assisting on the game winner against UNW. Graumann leads the Knights with eight goals and 20 total points this season.

The football team ran for 384 yards on the way to a 24-14 win at Westminster.

Junior running back **Joshuah Kren** (*WISCO*) ran for touchdowns of 54 and 79 yards in the first half on the way to a career-high 205 rushing yards on 19 carries. **Austin DeNoyer** (*Lakeside*) also had a big day on the ground with 191 yards on 24 carries.

The defense allowed a pair of touchdowns and 215 yards in the first half, but shut down the Blue Jays' offense in the second half, allowing only 28 total yards on 23 plays. **Dan Gensmer** (MLS) led the team with seven tackles and one sack.

Micah Otto *(LPS)* was named UMAC Special Teams Player of the Week after kicking a 33-yard field goal and making all three of his extra point attempts.
