MLC led UNW by as many as seven in the second half, but the Eagles were able to take control down the stretch to secure a 79-73 win. **Austin DeNoyer** (*Lakeside*) scored 18 points off the bench to lead the Knights, while Paulsen added a career-high 16 rebounds.

## **Kren Named Second Team All-Region**



Junior running back **Joshuah Kren** (WISCO) was named Second Team All-West Region on Tuesday by the website D3football.com.

Kren set a new MLC single-season record with 1,591 all-purpose yards from scrimmage while scoring 20 total touchowns (14 rushing, six receiving) in 2019.

Kren was previously named UMAC Most Valuable Offensive Player and First Team All-UMAC in November, and joined backfield teammate **Austin DeNoyer** (*Lakeside*) as the only MLC players to earn All-Region honors from the website.

Kren finished the season with 1,077 rushing yards on 135 carries and ranked fourth in all of NCAA Division III with a 7.93 yards-per-carry average.
