

## Paulsen Scores 1,000th Career Point

Senior **Ian Paulsen** (*LPS*) became the 12th player in MLC men's basketball program history to score at least 1,000 career points on Saturday, February 8, at Northwestern.

Paulsen entered the game with 988 career points and finished with 18 points in the team's 101-79 loss to the first-place Eagles.

Paulsen is currently tied for the team with an average of 11.3 points per game, and has averaged 12.3 points over his four-year career. This marks the fourth straight season Paulsen has led the Knights in points, rebounds, blocks, and steals per game, and the third straight year he has led the team in assists per game.
