### From the Portal



The MLC Portal is our campus bulletin board. This quick look contains some events that are coming up and some that are already over. We hope it gives you a feel for what's been going on at MLC, your student's home away from home!

- **Morning chapel:** Priority seating in the Chapel is by residence hall. See list below. All others are encouraged to worship in the chapel basement or by <u>livestream</u> in their dorm rooms.
  - Monday: AugustanaTuesday: Concord
  - Wednesday: Summit
  - Thursday: Centennial
  - Friday: Faculty/Staff/Walk-in
- **Compline**: Only chapel seating will be available for the Monday 10 pm Compline services. Services will also be <u>livestreamed</u>.
- **Weekend worship:** Because of restrictions on attendance at our local congregations, MLC will hold worship services on Saturday evenings (7 pm) and Sunday mornings (9:30 and 11 am). Students should sign up to reserve their seats. September 5-6 will be communion services. We will use continuous flow and hand out prepared communion kits.
- **#CampusClear:** Students should complete the #CampusClear daily health monitoring each day by noon before beginning any activities. Students not cleared because of symptoms should fill out the "Contact Me" form, and the campus nurse will contact them. If a student needs immediate medical attention, they should call their medical provider or dial 9-1-1.

- Fitness Center: Now requiring reservations. Sign up for 20-minute time slot.
- **Wellness Team challenge:** No soda/pop during September. All qualifying names will be entered into a drawing for a prize.
- **Wellness BINGO:** <u>Download</u> or pick up a BINGO card and turn it in by last day of September to qualify for a prize.
- Baseball: Informational meeting September 3.
- Saturday fitness class: Outdoor class Saturday, September 5, behind Luther Student Center. Sign up. Limit: 24.
- **Tickets for football scrimmage:** The Minnesota Department of Health allows us 165 spectators at this inter-squad scrimmage on Thursday, September 10. Students, faculty, and staff may pick up one of the 165 free tickets at the Athletic Office. Ticket needed for entry.
- **MLC Dance Club:** Outdoor rehearsals are Sundays and Wednesdays, 5:30-6:30, beginning September 13. No experience necessary.
- **Prison Ministry:** Sign up to help put together pamphlets and packages for mailing, or to correct Bible tests for our brothers and sisters in Christ in prison. Meetings 1-2 Thursdays a month.
- **Intramural sand volleyball:** Sign up your 4-8-player team for this coed league. Games played at Harmon Park evenings beginning at 7:45.
- Academic Success Center seeks tutors: Hiring tutors for Biology, Greek 3104 (Homer's *Iliad*), and Theology 4010 (Book of Acts-Greek).
