

## Women Drop Season Opener at UNW

The women's basketball team suffered a 90-62 defeat at Northwestern-St. Paul in its long-awaited season opener on Saturday, January 23.

The Knights showed signs of rust early as they could not buy a basket in the first quarter (3-23 shooting from the field), but warmed up as the game went along and finished with 11 three-point field goals, its most in a single game since December 12, 2018.

Erika Gosch (GPLHS) led the Knights with 14 points, while Meghan Blaine (MLS) finished with 11. Jordyn Heckendorf (KMLHS), Anna Treder (CLHS), and Emma Nelson (MVL) joined Blaine in scoring their first career collegiate points in their debuts.

## **Men Picked to Finish Ninth**

The men's basketball team was picked to finish ninth in the UMAC Preseason Coaches' Poll released on Monday, January 25.

The Knights, who finished the 2019-20 season with a 6-19 record, must replace four senior starters from last year's line-up, including Ian Paulsen ('20), who led the team in points, rebounds, assists, steals, and blocks per game each of the last three seasons.

Junior Jack Heichelbech (LPS) started 24 games last season and is the team's returning scoring leader at 8.5 points per game as a sophomore. Micah Kieselhorst (LPS) returns with him in the front court, while Jonathan Riebe (LPS), Joseph Hirsch (LPS), Jared Witkowiak (WISCO), and Joey Behm (KMLHS) will lead the charge on the perimeter.
