She will be joined by **Pastor Aaron Robinson** and **Professor Tingting Schwartz** to round out the Cultural Engagement staff.



The CEC serves to accomplish three core goals: to provide a welcoming space for our diverse students and support them during their time on campus, to be a venue for our entire campus family to engage in cross-cultural dialogue and understanding, and to promote community on campus among students, faculty, and staff, regardless of ethnicity or background.

Mrs. Kassuelke said that an official CEC opening celebration is slated for the fall with greater opportunity for group gatherings. She and her team want the MLC family to know that the center is meant to be a "'brave space' where diversity and culture-related discussions can take place in respectful, mindful, and authentic ways." Why are these efforts necessary? She said, "Because our Lord said to 'Make disciples of all nations.' Because the church is growing in diverse countries, cultures, and neighborhoods. And because WELS has international and multicultural ministry needs now." We can't wait for you to get involved in MLC's many intercultural opportunities, whether in the CEC, in the classroom, or on a trip abroad.

Mrs. Kassuelke said, "In the few months the CEC has been open, we've hosted a Chinese New Year celebration, MLK Day displays and events, and a student-led Spanish Bible study."

The Bible study is led by sophomore **Juan David Escobar** (*DSA / Divine Savior-Doral FL*) and senior **Ben Roekle** (*Shoreland LHS / First-Racine WI*). Both are preseminary majors active in MLC's Spanish program.

Those who come to Spanish Bible study will typically look at a particular section and discuss important themes from that Scripture, such as what it means to be Christ's disciples or to love their neighbor. The group also utilizes video resources from *Academia Cristo*, a huge part of the WELS mission to reach Spanish speakers with the gospel. God is on the move in all nations, and it is the goal of Martin Luther College to mobilize students in a wide array of cultures to do his work.
