Softball Tops Cougars in Slugfest

The softball team out-slugged Minnesota Morris to earn its first win of the season by the score of 16-10 on Monday.

The Knights recorded 21 hits in the game, and every player in the starting line-up finished with at least one hit and one run scored. MLC did most of its damage in the third inning, when it sent 14 hitters to the plate and scored 10 runs.

Jordyn Heckendorf (*KMLHS*), **Kylie Wolf** (*FVL*), **Brett Burger** (*Lakeside*), and **Lexi Fischer** (*MVL*) each finished the game with three hits. Burger also earned her first career win on the mound and struck out a career-high nine batters.
