

Women's Basketball Wins Opener

The women's basketball team opened the 2021-22 season with a 64-51 home win over Macalester College on Friday, October 5.

Defense led the way for the Knights, who held Macalester to 34.4 percent shooting overall and 5.9 percent from beyond the three-point arc. MLC also forced 26 turnovers, which they turned into 14 points on the other end.

Jordyn Heckendorf (*KMLHS*) led the offensive effort with 18 points, five rebounds and three assists. **Erika Gosch** (*GPLHS*) added 16 points and five steals, while **Emma Nelson** (*MVL*) grabbed a team-best eight rebounds to go with six points. First-year forward **Kendra Valleau** (*SCLA*) led all players with five assists.

Joshuah Kren (*WISCO*) led the Knights with 107 yards rushing and two touchdowns, while **Carson Oestreich** (*Norfolk NE*) added 97 yards and one touchdown on 24 carries. Oestreich also caught one pass for 54 yards.

Quarterbacks **Max Nordlie** (*MLS*) and **Ethan Aguilar** (*CLHS*) combined for 120 yards passing and one touchdown. **Mike Radue** (*WISCO*) caught three passes for 33 yards and one score.
