Senior football player **Andrew Owczarzak** (MLS) was named Second Team All-America by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) on December 14.

Owczarzak, a five-year starter at offensive tackle, is the first MLC player to ever receive All-America honors from the AFCA.

Prior to winning the AFCA honor, Owczarzak was named First Team All-UMAC for the second time in his career. He was also named All-Region by the website D3football.com after helping the Knights average 242.4 rushing yards per game. During his five seasons as the Knights' starting right tackle, MLC rushed for more than 12,000 yards and averaged more than 300 rushing yards per game in both 2019 and 2020.
