

Koelpin Steps Down as Men's Soccer Coach

Professor Paul Koelpin made the decision to step down as the head coach of the MLC men's soccer program at the end of his 27th season this fall.

Koelpin, the only head coach in the history of the men's soccer program at MLC, finished his career with 180 wins and three UMAC Coach of the Year honors. He also led the program to its only two UMAC Championships in program history during the 2002 and 2003 seasons.

Koelpin will continue in his role as professor at MLC, teaching general education and elective courses in the area of Western civilization, and a seminar course in historiography. MLC will announce its next men's soccer coach at a future date.

Defensively, Adam Arrowsmith (*MLS*), Abel Bain (*LPS*), Ben Riegsecker (*Nebraska LHS*), Noah Nordlie (*MLS*), Aiden Holien (*GPLHS*), and Ben Arndt (*SCLA*) got First Team All-UMAC recognition. Jon Holtz (*LPS*) was named to the second team. Holien also earned two Second Team All-UMAC honors as both a punt and kick returner.
