The women's basketball team opened 2022 with a 74-41 win over Mount Mary on January 6.

The Knights took the lead on an **Erika Gosch** (*GPLHS*) three-pointer on the first possession of the game and never looked back, winning each of the four quarters en route to their third win of the season.

Gosch finished the day with team highs in points (18), assists (five), and steals (three), but the biggest difference for the Knights came from a 31-0 advantage in points off the bench. First-year forward **Maya Price** (Northland Lutheran) set new career highs for points (10) and rebounds (14) in only 18 minutes of action off the bench. All 16 players for the Knights played in the game, with 13 of them scoring at least one point.
