The men's basketball team jumped out to a big lead and never slowed down in a 96-63 win at Maranatha Baptist on Saturday, January 29.

The offense led the way for the Knights as they set new season highs for points (96), three-point field goals (12), field goal percentage (.563), and three-point field goal percentage (.600).

The defense also contributed in the win as MLC forced 22 turnovers that led to 32 points on the other end, and also held MBU to .396 percent shooting for the game.

Joseph Hirsch (*LPS*) led the Knights with 22 points. Ezra Blumer (*SCLA*) added 15 points and a team-best seven rebounds and four assists. Micah Kieselhorst (*LPS*) and Jack Heichelbech (*LPS*) added 14 and 12 points, respectively.

**Josiah Wordell** *(KMLHS)* and **Elijah Schulz** *(LPS)* were responsible for the two points for the men in singles competition against the Cardinals.

Wordell won his number-four singles match in straight sets (6-3, 6-4), while Schulz won a third-set tie-breaker in his number-five singles match (6-3, 0-1, 1-0).
