

Women Come Back to Top UWS 69-67

The women's basketball team scored its first ever win over UW-Superior by the score of 69-67 on Friday, February 4.

The Knights trailed 41-27 at halftime, but outscored UWS 42-26 the rest of the way to earn their first win over the Yellowjackets in 13 tries.

The MLC offense shot 41.7 percent from the field and made 20 of 24 attempts from the free throw line in the second half, while the defense held UWS to 25.8 percent shooting in the final two quarters. **Emma Nelson** (*MVL*) led MLC with 12 points, while **Anna Treder** (*CLHS*) and **Kortney Behnke** (*FVL*) each added 11 points. **Jordyn Heckendorf** (*KMLHS*) recorded a team-best five assists.

Men Come From Behind Twice to Top UWS



The men's basketball team overcame a seven-point halftime deficit on the way to a 62-61 win over UW-Superior on Friday, February 4. The win was the Knights' first over the Yellowjackets since 2018.

The Knights struggled in the first half on the way to a 32-25 halftime deficit, but shot 58.6 percent from the field in the second half to take a 60-51 lead with under four minutes to play. UWS responded with a 10-0 run to wrestle the lead back, but **Ezra Blumer**'s *(SCLA)* acrobatic layup with 4.5 seconds remaining gave the Knights the lead and the win.

First-year forward **Seth Veers** (*Lakeside*) led the offense with 16 points (on 7-7 shooting) to go with eight rebounds. **Jack Heichelbech** (*LPS*) added 13 points, while Blumer finished with 11 points and team-high nine rebounds.
