Heckendorf Named Honorable Mention All-UMAC

Sophomore women's basketball player **Jordyn Heckendorf** (*KMLHS*) was named Honorable Mention All-UMAC by the conference on Monday, February 28.

Heckendorf's second season was a breakout campaign as she led the team in points per game (11.8), assists (67), steals (40), three-point field goals (37), and free throws made (50). She also led the Knights in minutes played per game (28.5) and started 25 of the team's 26 games.

Down the stretch, Heckendorf closed the season on a high note with six consecutive games scoring in double figures, including a career-high 26 points in the Knights' near upset of Northwestern-St. Paul in the regular season finale on Saturday, February 19.

Baseball Ready to Open Season



Cox slides into third

The baseball team looks to open the 2022 season with its annual Florida trip this week during spring break. The Knights leave for warmer weather on Thursday, March 3, and will return on Tuesday, March 8, with eight games under their belt.

The Knights were picked to finish eighth in the conference's preseason coaches' poll released in February, but return a number of key players who gained experience during the 2021 season.

Mason Cox (*MVL*) and **Jonas Lindemann** (*LPS*) each return after being named Honorable Mention All-UMAC in 2021. Cox led the team in batting average (.313) and stolen bases (five) during his debut season last spring, while Lindemann returns for his fourth season behind the plate (where he started all 21 games last year) after hitting .254 with a pair of doubles and eight runs scored.

Senior men's basketball player **Jack Heichelbech** (*LPS*) was named Honorable Mention All-UMAC on Tuesday, March 1.

Heichelbech led the Knights in points per game (11.5), field goal percentage (.528), and free throws made (25) during conference play this season, while averaging 10.2 points per game over the course of the season.

Heichelbech started 74 of his 87 career games and finished his four-year career with 830 points and 305 rebounds.
