

Klement Throws Shutout in 1-0 Win Over UWS

The baseball team rode a complete game shutout from sophomore pitcher **Zach Klement** (*WISCO*) to a 1-0 win over UW-Superior in the program's first win over the Yellowjackets since the 2019 season.

Klement wove his way out of trouble throughout the game, scattering 10 hits while striking out seven. The MLC defense also came through without committing an error to keep the Yellowjackets off the scoreboard.

The Knights' lone run came in the third inning when **Andrew Deisinger** (*LPS*) singled home **Jonas Lindemann** (*LPS*), who led off the rally with a double down the right field line with one out.

Hoffman Breaks Career and Single-Season RBI Records



Senior first baseman **Elena Hoffman** (*GPLHS*) added two more records to her collection this season by setting the new MLC single-season and career softball marks for runs batted in (RBI).

Through 28 games this season, Hoffman has recorded 43 RBI, smashing the previous MLC single-season mark of 34 set by **Kaitlyn Schumacher** '07 in 2005.

Hoffman's big season also propelled her to the top of the career list with 115 RBI, breaking the previous mark of 99 held by **Karla Opperman** '13.

Prior to the two RBI records, Hoffman broke the school record for career home runs (currently 22), and also tied the single-season home run record with eight in 2019. This season, Hoffman is batting .458 with a team-best five home runs.
