Men Take Second at UMAC Outdoor Championships

The men's track and field team finished second at the UMAC Outdoor Championships last week with a program record 182.5 total points at the two-day meet.

Carson Oestreich (*Norfolk NE*) accounted for 22 of those points by himself after taking first place in the 100 Meter Dash (10.76) and 200 Meter Dash (22.36), as well as helping the 4x100 Meter Relay team finish second. Oestreich was named All-UMAC for his efforts, along with **Zach Scheuerlein** (*LPS*) and **Micah Schibbelhut** (*LPS*).

Scheuerlein finished second in the Javelin, while Schibbelhut scored points in four events, including a second-place finish in the Pole Vault. **Caleb Foelske** *(Manitowoc LHS)* accounted for 19 points in four events and broke his own school records in the Shot Put and Hammer Throw.

Six MLC Women Named All-UMAC

The women's track and field team broke last year's school record with 140 points at the UMAC Outdoor Championships en route to a fourth-place finish last week.

Six MLC student-athletes earned All-UMAC honors following the event, led by senior **Emily Dobberstein** *(Luther)*, who set a new MLC record with a first-place time of 1:06.7 in the 400 Meter Hurdles. She also took fourth in the 100 Meter Hurdles and 400 Meters on the way to 22 points.


Ally Platzer (Olivet MI) won the Pole Vault with a top height of 2.62 meters, while Margaret Gabb (LPS), Maya Habben (LPS), Emma Nelson (MVL), and Claire Tomhave (LPS) combined to win the 4x400 Meter Relay. All four of those relay participants also scored points in at least two other events, with Nelson scoring top-six finishes in the 400 Meter Hurdles, Shot Put, and Discus.

Cox Breaks Two MLC Single-Season Records

Sophomore baseball player **Mason Cox** (*MVL*) finished the season with a pair of MLC single-season records.

Cox set new MLC marks in both batting average (.476) and on-base percentage (.540) this season, breaking the previous records previously set in both categories by **Joel Heckendorf** ('97) during the 1996 season. He also recorded 50 hits this season, tying him with **Andrew Nemmers** ('15) for that record.

After two seasons with the program, Cox now sits atop the MLC career record books in both batting average (.414) and on-base percentage (.480).
