






Joseph likes to pretend. Some days he's a doctor.




Other days he's a construction worker.




Joe likes to play church too. He's the pastor, and his brother and sister are the congregation.

They sing hymns and pray the Lord's Prayer.




He especially likes to preach the sermon. He talks about Jesus dying on the cross as the payment for everyone's sins.

<sup>&</sup>quot;How do you get to be one?" Joe asked.


<sup>&</sup>quot;Let's visit Pastor Daniel and find out," said Mom.




The next Saturday, Joe and his pastor had a good talk.

At the baptismal font, he said, "It makes me happy to think about all the little ones that the Holy Spirit brings to faith right here."


Joe smiled as he remembered his younger brother's baptism day.




Then they stepped to the altar.




Pastor Daniel pointed to a nearby stained glass window.

"I pray with people who are in the hospital and remind them that God is with them. I visit older members who can't get to church and have little worship services with them at their homes."




"Sometimes people just come to talk to me when they're worried about something. We talk about God's love and promises, and we pray together."




"Pastors help a lot of people," said Joe. "I didn't know about all of these important things that you do."




"There's nothing more important!" said Pastor Daniel.


"Pastors use the Word of God to guide and encourage people through this life on earth, and to get them ready for the next life—where they'll be for eternity!"
