Paying for college can be difficult, but we've got 450 ways for you to make some bucks! About 450 different jobs on campus are filled by 250 students this year. (Yes, some students have two jobs.) If you want to work, you'll be able to find a job!

What do you like to do?

Do you enjoy being surrounded by books? Maybe you'd be a good fit for the library, reshelving returns or helping a student find sources for their next big paper.

Athletically inclined? Maybe you'd enjoy working in the training room or supervising our Fitness Center, like **Carson Oestreich** (*Pierce HS-NE / Immanuel-Hadar NE, pictured left*).

Are you a creative? You could apply for a photographer or social media position. Want to share your love of MLC? Maybe you can work as a student ambassador, giving tours and assisting the Admissions Office.

If you just like people, you could apply to be a student receptionist, like **Marissa Zaye** (*ALA / Our Savior-Bylas AZ, pictured below*).

Other options? You could work in the Cultural Engagement Center, the Early Childhood Learning Center, the Records Office, the mailroom, or the cafeteria. You could be part of the Events Team, a tutor in the Academic

Success Center, or a scorekeeper at athletic events. You could join the custodian or groundskeeper teams or even work in campus security. You'd be surprised at the number and types of jobs available!



What if you're eligible for work-study jobs?



If you have financial need, as demonstrated by your FAFSA, you may be eligible for Federal Work-Study (FWS). That means the government pays part of your salary for your MLC job. Whether you're FWS or not, note that you'll need to apply for campus jobs. MLC does not assign jobs to any students.

What if you want to work off campus?

New Ulm has 14,000 citizens and lots of places to work! You could coach a team at our Lutheran or public schools, work as an office assistant, ref basketball games, write sports stories for the *New Ulm Journal*, provide childcare, teach music lessons, tutor students, provide care for adults with developmental challenges, teach fitness classes, work as a lifeguard or swim instructor, wait tables at Applebee's or some other restaurant, work retail at a little New Ulm boutique, work at a factory (3M and Kraft are big New Ulm industries), or do yardwork, housework, or even agricultural work. If you want to work, you'll find something!
