VOM HIMMEL HOCH

In 1830 Franz Hauser, a Viennese singer and Bach enthusiast, sent a Lutheran hymnal, *Lutherisches Liedbüchlein*, to Mendelssohn, who was on an extended stay in Rome. Mendelssohn was struck with the beauty and power of Luther's hymns and immediately conceived a project to compose a series of cantatas based on them. He began work on *Vom Himmel hoch*, "From Heaven on High," in October of 1830 and completed it the following January at the age of 21.

Mendelssohn's treatment of Luther's Christmas hymn is directly modeled on a form used by J.S. Bach, the *chorale cantata*, in which one of more verses of the chorale text are set in movements that alternate between chorus and soloists.

Mendelssohn's *Vom Himmel hoch*, "From Heaven on High," is a setting of seven stanzas chosen from the fifteen of Luther's hymn. The first two stanzas are combined in the opening chorus (featured in this Christmas program). It begins with an orchestra introduction, in which a brilliant string figuration suggests the angel descending with the Christmas message. The hymn melody makes its first appearance in a contrapuntal treatment of its first line with the text "For you this day a child is born," and is stated in full at the very end of the movement.
