#### **LESSONS 2 Chronicles 5:2-14** - *The Ark Brought to the Temple*

<sup>2</sup> Then Solomon summoned to Jerusalem the elders of Israel, all the heads of the tribes and the chiefs of the Israelite families, to bring up the ark of the LORD's covenant from Zion, the City of David. <sup>3</sup> And all the Israelites came together to the king at the time of the festival in the seventh month. <sup>4</sup> When all the elders of Israel had arrived, the Levites took up the ark, <sup>5</sup> and they brought up the ark and the tent of meeting and all the sacred furnishings in it. The Levitical priests carried them up; <sup>6</sup> and King Solomon and the entire assembly of Israel that had gathered about him were before the ark, sacrificing so many sheep and cattle that they could not be recorded or counted.

<sup>7</sup> The priests then brought the ark of the LORD's covenant to its place in the inner sanctuary of the temple, the Most Holy Place, and put it beneath the wings of the cherubim. <sup>8</sup> The cherubim spread their wings over the place of the ark and covered the ark and its carrying poles. <sup>9</sup> These poles were so long that their ends, extending from the ark, could be seen from in front of the inner sanctuary, but not from outside the Holy Place; and they are still there today. <sup>10</sup> There was nothing in the ark except the two tablets that Moses had placed in it at Horeb, where the LORD made a covenant with the Israelites after they came out of Egypt.

<sup>11</sup>The priests then withdrew from the Holy Place. All the priests who were there had consecrated themselves, regardless of their divisions. <sup>12</sup> All the Levites who were musicians—Asaph, Heman, Jeduthun and their sons and relatives—stood on the east side of the altar, dressed in fine linen and playing cymbals, harps and lyres. They were accompanied by 120 priests sounding trumpets. <sup>13</sup> The trumpeters and musicians joined in unison to give praise and thanks to the LORD. Accompanied by trumpets, cymbals and other instruments, the singers raised their voices in praise to the LORD and sang: "He is good; his love endures forever." Then the temple of the LORD was filled with the cloud, <sup>14</sup> and the priests could not perform their service because of the cloud, for the glory of the LORD filled the temple of God.

#### Revelation 7:9-17 - The Great Multitude in White Robes

<sup>9</sup> After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. <sup>10</sup>And they cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb." <sup>11</sup> All the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures. They fell down on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, <sup>12</sup> saying:

"Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom and thanks and honor and power and strength be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!"

<sup>13</sup> Then one of the elders asked me, "These in white robes—who are they, and where did they come from?" <sup>14</sup> I answered, "Sir, you know." And he said, "These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. <sup>15</sup> Therefore, "they are before the throne of God and serve him day and night in his temple; and he who sits on the throne will shelter them with his presence. <sup>16</sup> 'Never again will they hunger; never again will they thirst. The sun will not beat down on them,' nor any scorching heat. <sup>17</sup> For the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd; 'he will lead them to springs of living water.'

Luke 2:41-52 - The Boy Jesus at the Temple

<sup>41</sup> Every year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the Festival of the Passover. <sup>42</sup> When he was twelve years old, they went up to the festival, according to the custom. <sup>43</sup> After the festival was over, while his parents were returning home, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but they were unaware of it. <sup>44</sup> Thinking he was in their company, they traveled on for a day. Then they began looking for him among their relatives and friends. <sup>45</sup> When they did not find him, they went back to Jerusalem to look for him. <sup>46</sup> After three days they found him in the temple courts, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. <sup>47</sup> Everyone who heard him was amazed at his understanding and his answers. <sup>48</sup> When his parents saw him, they were astonished. His mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us like this? Your father and I have been anxiously searching for you."

<sup>49</sup> "Why were you searching for me?" he asked. #### About the Steinway Concert Grand:

In January of 2019, a significant donation was given to MLC for the purchase of a concert (9-foot) grand piano for the Chapel of the Christ. The donation was given anonymously in honor of two called workers, Mary Prange and Marvin Busse. In February of 2019, at the invitation of the Steinway representatives at Schmitt Music Company in Brooklyn Center MN, a selection committee from MLC traveled to New York City to tour the Steinway factory and choose the piano. As Fritz Reuter himself turned to the quality of Steinway back in 1911 when "The College" was in need of a piano, we are also blessed to have such a beautiful, high-quality new instrument in the chapel today. Both pianos will receive regular use for worship and concerts in the chapel.
