
Preservice Music

Procession


As the handbell sounds the tone for the opening sentences, stand and face the processional candle, which represents Christ, the light of the world.

For those who work to bring peace, justice, health, and protection in this and every place, let us pray to the Lord:


Lord, have mercy.


For favorable weather, for an abundance of the fruits of the earth, and for peaceful times, let us pray to the Lord:

Amen.


Lord's Prayer
