- 8. New Ulm: New Ulm Recreation Center (Vogel Arena)—Walking track, fitness equipment and classes, indoor pool
- 9. New Ulm: Park & Rec Activities for adults and kids,
- 10. New Ulm: <u>Schell's Brewery</u>—Brewery tour and gardens
- 11. New Ulm: <u>Wanda Gag House</u>—Tour during regular hours, or visit a special program such as Wanda's birthday celebration in March
- 12. New Ulm (rural): Harkin Store—1870s general store with weekend special activities
- 13. Blue Earth: Jolly Green Giant and Museum
- 14. Comfrey (rural): <u>Jeffers Petroglyphs—</u>American Indian rock carvings
- 15. Darwin: World's Largest Twine Ball (rolled by one man)
- 16. Fairfax (rural): <u>Ft. Ridgely State Park</u> and <u>Historic Site—</u>Camping, tubing in winter, amphitheater, hiking, historic fort
- 17. Fairmont: Aquatic Park—Pool, waterslides
- 18. Gaylord: Aquatic Center—Pool, waterslides, adjacent to city park
- 19. Glencoe: Oak Leaf Park—Camping, aquatic center, playground
- 20. Henderson (rural): <u>Ney Nature Center</u>—County park with nature-related programming
- 21. Henderson: Toody's Sweet Treats—Old-fashioned soda fountain with other goodies
- 22. Henderson (rural): Zip Line Minnesota/Kerfoot Canopy Tour—Zip line tours
- 23. Hutchinson: Aquatic Center—Pool, waterslides, lazy river
- 24. Jordan: Minnesota's Largest Candy Store
- 25. Le Sueur: W.W. Mayo House—Historic home of the founders of Mayo Clinic
- 26. Le Sueur: Froqqy's Cotton Candy Bar
- 27. Madelia: Watona Park—Disc golf, camping, fishing, golf course, playground
- 28. Madelia/LaSalle: <u>Younger Brothers capture site and reenactment</u>—Jesse James' gang members
- 29. Mankato: Children's Museum of Southern Minnesota
- 30. Mankato: Kato Escape—Escape room
- 31. Mankato: <u>Mankato Moondogs</u>—Northern League baseball with fun promotions and activities
- 32. Mankato (rural): Minnemishinona Falls—Waterfall with bike trail adjacent, on scenic Judson Bottom Road

- 33. Mankato (rural): Minneopa Falls State Park—Waterfall, hiking trails, camping
- 34. Mankato: Minnesota State University Rock Wall—Rock climbing wall
- 35. Mankato (rural): Rapidan Dam Park and Store—Park with camping and trails; store is well known for its pie and other café items
- 36. Mankato: Sibley Park—Large park with zoo, sledding hill, and more; holiday lights in December
- 37. Morton (rural): Birch Coulee Battlefield
- 38. Morton (rural): Lower Sioux Agency Historic Site
- 39. Norwood-Young America: <u>Baylor Regional Park—</u>Boardwalk trail, camping, swimming beach, disc golf, observatory
- 40. Redwood Falls: Alexander Ramsey Park—Large park with trails, small zoo, camping, playground, and waterfall
- 41. Redwood Falls: <u>Aquatic Center</u>—Pool, waterslides
- 42. Redwood Falls (North Redwood): Birthplace of Sears Roebuck Co.
- 43. Sanborn (Rural): Sod House on the Prairie—Replica sod houses and restored prairie area
- 44. Sleepy Eye: <u>Aquatic Center</u>—Pool, waterslides
- 45. Springfield: City Park—Swimming pool, campground, disc golf, bicycle trail
- 46. St. Peter: E. St. Julien Cox House—1871 Italianate home
- 47. St. Peter: Traverse des Sioux and Treaty Site History Center—Historic site and museum
- 48. Walnut Grove: Ingalls Dugout Site—On the banks of Plum Creek—and Laura Ingalls Wilder Museum
- 49. Walnut Grove: Wilder Pageant—Play based on Laura Ingalls Wilder's time in Walnut Grove, held annually on weekends in July
- 50. Waseca: Farmamerica Learn about farming; historical buildings and events
